Dear Sir,

With reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your son, the late Lieutenant P. Taylor, M.M., 20th Battalion, I am now in receipt of advice which shows that he was killed on 2.9.18 during an attack on the enemy position near Mont St. Quentin, France, and was buried at that place. A cross has been erected over the grave.

The utmost care and attention is being devoted, where possible, to the graves of our fallen Officers and Men. It is understood photographs are being taken as soon as practicable for transmission to next-of-kin.

These additional details are furnished by direction, it being the policy of the Department to forward all information received in connection with deaths of members of the Australian Imperial Force.






